## GETTING TO KNOW YOU. . . .

Q. How long have you been a member and what brought you to 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue Christian Church?

A. I have been a member at 15th Ave Christian Church for 27 years. Rick and Kim Miers invited us to church and Rod's Uncle, Warren Leatherman, was a member.

Q. Tell me a little about your work and/or home life, past or present.

A. I have been married to Rod for 28 years. We have 5 children and 6 grandchildren. I have been a nurse for 25 years. I worked on the cardiac unit and the last 22 years I have been with UnityPoint at Home. Although I work for home care, for the last 12 years I am actually working at the hospital where I coordinate home care for discharging patients. I am currently back in school to become a nurse practitioner.

Q. Can you tell us something unique about you, something others may not know?

A. I used to love team sports. I did not play any sports for many years, but this fall I started playing dek hockey. In dek hockey each team has a goalie and you play 3 on 3. This is played outside in tennis shoes with a ball instead of a puck.

Q. What is your involvement in church and community?

A. I don't have a lot of free time now that I am a student again. I completed the UnityPoint Parish Nurse class and have made numerous home visits, hospital visits, and nursing home visits. I am happy to try to answer medical questions, give education on home care, hospice care, palliative care, and community resources. I also can help find physicians if needed. I help every year with Rock Island sports physicals for junior high and high school students. This was free and now is offered for \$5.00. I volunteer a few times a year at various food pantries checking blood pressures, blood sugars, and giving flu shots. At church I like to sing in the choir and serve as a deacon. One of my projects is to repurpose medical equipment. I collect gently used equipment, some of which came from 15th Avenue, the rest from other donations through the parish nurse program. The hospital case managers and visiting nurse staff call when they have someone in need of equipment. If we have what they need, I clean and deliver it to the patient in the hospital or their home. There are a few people at 15th Avenue that knit or crochet prayer shawls. I give those to people at the hospital or nursing home with a note signed from our church.

Q. Why do you give of your Time, Talents, and Treasures?

A. I give of my talents because I feel God calls his children to do this. I like the feeling I get when I can help someone else. I think this quote by Hillel a first century Jewish scholar explains why perfectly. "*If not you, then who? If not now, when?*"




