#### **Pastor's Corner**

Easter is one of the special days in the church year that move around, and because of that it has been called "a moveable feast". Pentecost is also a moveable feast because it comes fifty days (the seventh Sunday) after Easter. The Easter date can vary by as much as 35 days. The rule is, we celebrate Easter on: *the first Sunday after the first full moon after the first day of Spring*. The reason for this method is that Christian tradition has kept the celebration of Easter aligned with the Jewish feast of Passover in remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion during that annual event in Jerusa-lem. Passover was tied to the seasons, the lunar cycle, and to the barley harvest.

This year we had a full moon on March 18<sup>th</sup>, which was before we had officially hit Spring. The first full moon after March 20<sup>th</sup> will be on April 16<sup>th</sup>. The rule directs us to celebrate Easter on the first Sunday *after* April 16<sup>th</sup> and that happens to be just one day later this year! In 2023, Easter will be on April 9<sup>th</sup>. Over the past 500 years, the most common dates for Easter Sunday have been March 31<sup>st</sup> and April 16<sup>th</sup>. There have been many systems and algorithms proposed to do the math associated with the moveable feasts. One of the more modern proposals was brought forward in 1991.

Just as we have Pentecost 50 days after Easter, the season of Lent kicks off 40 days before Easter. From Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday is 46 calendar days, but the six Sundays are not counted as days of Lent within the Protestant tradition. The days of Lent are a season for repentance, reflection, and confession. Just as Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas, Lent is a season of preparation for Easter. There is darkness, and then the dawn. There is crucifixion, and then resurrection. We wait in hope, "as the sentinel waits for the dawn."

The days of Holy Week follow Jesus' passion. The suffering and death of Jesus led to the darkness that was observed in the middle of the afternoon on Good Friday. Easter is all about that darkness being defeated by the light of Christ." *He is not here for he has risen just as he said.*" Darkness is vanquished and death itself has been defeated. We celebrate victory over sin and death as we ponder Jesus' words, "*I am the resurrection and the life.*"

"So we're not giving up. How could we! Even though on the outside it often looks like things are falling apart on us, on the inside, where God is making new life, not a day goes by without his unfolding grace. These hard times are small potatoes compared to the coming good times, the lavish celebration prepared for us. There's far more here than meets the eye. The things we see now are here today, gone tomorrow. But the things we can't see now will last forever."



# Easter is April 17

### **Seasons and Colors of the Christian Year**

God's people use the liturgical church calendar to help them in their worship life. Beginning with the season of Advent and extending through the season of Pentecost, the Church Year consists of two halves - the festival portion and the non-festival portion. The first half (Advent to Pentecost) reminds us of what God has done and continues to do for us through Christ Jesus. The second half (Pentecost to Advent) focuses on our response to God's goodness to us in Christ.

In all there are six seasons of the Church Year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. The following colors are associated with these seasons, illustrated by the paraments on the altar, pulpit, and lectern and the stoles worn by the pastors:

**Blue** - (Advent) reminds us of the blessed eternal hope that is ours in Christ. Blue can represent penance, sacrifice

**White** - (Christmas and Easter) is the color of purity, holiness, glory, and joy. White can represent Purity, light, glory, joy.

**Green** - (Epiphany and after Pentecost) represents the Christian life and growth in the faith. Green can represent life, hope, and anticipation.

**Purple** - (Lent) reminds us of our need for repentance and preparation for the celebration of Easter. Purple has often been associated with royalty. Purple can represent penance, sacrifice, and preparation.

**Red** - (Pentecost) the color of fire and blood, represents the work of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. Red can represent God's love, blood, and fire.

Lent— Violet/Purple Maundy Thursday — White/Gold Good Friday — Red/Black/None Easter — White/Gold Easter Tide — White/Gold
