### A Message from Pastor Mike

We have been looking at the beginnings of the church in the Book of Acts in recent weeks. We have seen the way that the gospel spread out from Jerusalem, to Judea, to Samaria and all over the known world, just as Jesus predicted: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." - Acts 1:8 -

One of the most helpful texts about the early church can be found in Acts chapter 2, verse 42. "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." In one simple verse we find four key practices of the early church! First, they devoted themselves to the apostle's teaching. That means they were aware of the content of the letters of Paul and of the early writings of the apostles of Jesus themselves. The Book of Acts was probably written around 90AD, or just over 60 years after Jesus' resurrection and ascension. Scholars seem to agree that that is the general timeframe for the gospels of Matthew, Luke, and John as well. (The Gospel of Mark may have been written a couple of decades earlier, probably between 66-74AD.)

The earliest Christians also had what we might call potlucks! They spent time with one another and they ate meals together. They shared their lives and their faith, even as they lived in a culture which wasn't very tolerant of their religious convictions. They also met together and shared communion on a regular basis, modeling it, much as we do, after Jesus celebration of the Last Supper. And finally, Acts 2:42 tells us that the early Christians devoted themselves to prayer. There is a strong connection between these four practices, and together they paint a picture of how the early church lived out their faith in community. The people studied Scripture, they spent time together, they shared communion and meals, and they spent time in prayer. Despite the passage of time and the differences in location and culture, these practices are well worth considering for our own lives.

We probably aren't going to take missionary journeys like the apostle Paul. We may never be shipwrecked, imprisoned, persecuted and run out of town. We may not have the same troubles that the earliest Christians had, but we can continue to apply these same four helpful practices that they engaged in. The Disciples of Christ have been known as Restorationist people over the years. That simply means that our heritage has been to look to the New Testament for guidance on how to be the church together. We can renew our personal and community commitments to gathering, sharing communion, digging into Scripture together, and practicing prayer. Kind of like blocking and tackling are the basics in football, you might say that these four practices continue to be the basics of our faith.

May God bless you as we enter the summer season!

### Music Notes


