A Message from Pastor Mike.....

We are now entering Holy Week, the most sacred week in the entire Christian church calendar. We probably don't spend enough time thinking about the significance of each day of this special week, and the Scriptures that are thought to have described events that happened on each of those days. Holy Monday is the traditional day of remembering Jesus' cursing of the fig tree and the cleansing of the temple (Luke 11:12-25.) Holy Tuesday is said to be the day that Jesus spoke these words from chapter 12 of John's gospel, "Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Holy Wednesday is sometimes called "Spy Wednesday" because that's when Judas negotiated for thirty pieces of silver to betray Jesus to the religious leaders (Matthew 26:15).

Holy Thursday is usually called Maundy Thursday, after the Latin word for "commandment." Jesus told the disciples, at the Last Supper, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." (John 13:34) Maundy Thursday services may include foot-washing in remembrance of Jesus washing the disciples' feet, and Peter's denial of Jesus. Either Maundy Thursday or Good Friday services often include Tenebrae observances. That word means shadows or darkness, and a Tenebrae service often includes darkness in the church as a set of candles are gradually extinguished following a series of Scripture readings.

Good Friday services, in some faith traditions, may also focus on the passion of Christ (his trial, beating, and then his death on the cross), or the Stations of the Cross, which mark events along the way to Calvary. Sometimes services present the famous 7 last words of Christ on the cross. Holy Saturday marks the so-called Easter Vigil. That is the day between Jesus' death and the resurrection on Easter morning. The "three days in the tomb" included part of Good Friday, all of Holy Saturday, and part of Easter Sunday morning. Throughout church history, candidates for baptism have been instructed in the faith during the weeks of Lent and then they have been baptized as part of the Easter Sunday services. Many churches hold Sunrise services because that is the traditional time that Jesus' followers went to the tomb to find the stone had been rolled away! In Luke's gospel, two angelic beings were there to announce that Jesus had been raised. Centuries later, we join our voices in proclaiming, He is risen indeed!

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be untied with him in a resurrection like his." – Romans 6:3-11 –
