

A Message from Pastor Mike.....

The leaves are really coming down these days, along with the temperature! As the harvest season is winding down, we turn our thoughts toward the approaching holiday season. We observe All Saints Day on November 1st, we will celebrate Thanksgiving and Christmas, and before we know it the calendar will turn over to a new year. Nature's seasons help us mark time throughout the year. There is a natural progression from one phase to the next. Tulip bulbs, garden seeds, crops in the field... all change and grow as the days go by. The seasons of our lives change too. We do our best to grow and develop as followers of Christ. We endure storms and dry spells. We experience wonder and joy. It all works together and we often find ourselves surprised that so much time has slipped by while we have been busy with life.

Years ago, a farm hand would be considered a *star* if they could harvest about 100 bushels of corn by hand per day. That was probably about an acre back in the 1920s to 1940s. The best huskers are said to have been capable of plucking and tossing *35 to 50* ears per minute! The farming environment gives us just one example of how quickly the world around us changes. The latest combines on the market have engines approaching 700 horsepower. The can cost \$750,000 or more. The grain tank on those monsters can hold almost 500 bushels! They can unload at the rate of 5-6 bushels per minute! In good conditions, they can vacuum up 7,000 bushels per hour, which is enough corn to fill 7 semi-trailers. Progress is wonderful, but it can bring new problems and unexpected issues. Compared to the old corn husking days, these massive new machines create a material handling problem for their owners. How do you keep up that kind of productive pace? What if the grain bins or the elevators are miles away? Each development requires adaptation and additional thinking, invention, and entrepreneurial spirit.

It is the same with our spiritual lives and with our life together as the church. In the 1920s and 1930s, people could hear the gospel on their new-fangled radios. These days, we have unlimited (and previously unimagined) resources for growing and developing our faith. We also have enormous reach with our message of hope. That can create new issues for us. It's wonderful that our snowbirds can see our services online, but that same amazing capability also means we can "attend" services any time of the day or night. We can get away with wearing pajamas or bib overalls to on-line church! We don't always see each other's faces in this new world of worship. The wider church is adapting and changing as the seasons pass. We can rest assured that the Holy Spirit is still at work in the world. 2 Corinthians 9:10 says, "He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your right-eousness." May God continue to bless and keep you as we move into the holiday season, and into new ways of being the church together.
