

A Message from Pastor Mike-

There are many, many places in the Bible which talk about someone waiting. Our church season of Advent is here once again and it is all about waiting. Waiting can be tough for us modern folk! It really helps to know that God waits with us. It's like we are in a dentist's or a doctor's office, and God is there to keep us company as we wait. We gradually learn that we need patience in order to see what God has in store for us next.

I saw a Tyndale article which provided these five reasons that waiting can be beneficial for us...

Waiting helps us slow down.

Waiting helps us notice new things.

Waiting helps us remember what we really want / need.

Waiting gives us time to prepare.

Waiting gives us the choice to trust.

This is a very good list! Here we see that waiting can help us with our faith, hope, and love. Waiting helps us learn, from personal experience, that God's promises are true. Waiting helps us learn patient trust. Waiting helps us develop humility, endurance, and Christian hope.

In the Old testament, Abraham and Sarah waited 25 years before the child promised by God arrived in their lives. Joseph waited for years and years to understand why he had been sold into slavery in Egypt. Moses had to wait 40 years before he was called back to Egypt. The Israelites milled around in the desert for 40 more years before they were given the green light to cross the Jordan River into the Promised Land. Psalm 27:14 says, "*Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord.*" David waited for years after Samuel announced that he would one day be named king. From the age of 15 or 16, David waited. Psalm 40:1 says, "*I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry.*" Enduring patiently, he was eventually crowned king when he was 30 years old.

In the New Testament, we find more examples of patient waiting. Jesus waited until he was age thirty before he began his public ministry. After Paul's conversion on the Road to Damascus, he waited three years to begin his ministry to the Gentiles. There are many other examples, throughout Scripture, that show us the importance of patience during times of waiting.

Romans 12:12 says, "*Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.*" Those are wise words for our busy age.

As we wait for the weeks of Advent to bring us to Christmas morning, may we join with the prophet Micah, who wrote, "But as for me, I watch in hope for the Lord, I wait for God my Savior; my God will hear me." Have a blessed Christmas!

"They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; they shall walk, and not faint." - Isaiah 40:31 -
