## . . . . . A message from Pastor Mike

The season of Lent remind us that there are practical aspects to living our lives of faith. Why do we believe the things we believe and why do we do the things we do? It's like an annual life review which helps us stay focused on what is truly important. We will take a look at the Ten Commandments this Sunday, and they too help us stay focused as we make our way through these weeks leading up to Easter, and all along the path of life. Some of the commandments are about our relationship to God and some are about our relationships with each other. There is a very strong sense of community represented in the writings of the Old Testament, including the Exodus account of Moses' reception of the commandments and the Law. How we treat each other matters. We are all integral parts of larger groups and not just making our solitary way through the trials of life. We are family members, neighbors, citizens, coworkers, and much more. It is necessary pay attention as individuals and as members of various communities.

The late Frederick Buechner, an author and preacher worth exploring, wrote: "Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery it is. In the boredom and pain of it, no less than in the excitement and gladness; touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it, because in the last analysis all moments are key moments, and life itself is grace." It had been said that all Christians are theologians. We may not feel equipped to explain our faith experiences and our sense of God's presence, but those things do impact us at every level - as individuals and as members of our various communities.

I am serving on our regional Committee on Ministry This role gives me a chance to hear and be in relationship with many candidates for ministry. Some are on the track to be commissioned for service to a specific church, and some are on the ordination track. If they are seminary students, there is a fair amount of discussion about course content and planning, spiritual formation, spiritual disciplines and practices. These candidates are under the care of the region, where conversations about calling and discernment can take place.

Something similar happens here in our local congregation. We are part of a community of faith where we listen to each other and grow together. We celebrate and mourn, we wonder and hope. We engage in worship and we share our lives together. It is a blessing to be able to gather around the table, to listen to each other, and to help one another discern God's leading. It is a blessing and an encouragement to be able to listen to each other and to listen to God together. May you experience God's blessing and peace as we make our way, together, toward Easter Sunday.
