Seminary teachers and veteran preachers usually recommend that beginning pastors choose their sermon texts from the Revised Common Lectionary for their first few years of ministry. Each week, the lectionary provides us with four options for the Sunday sermon. There is a selection from the Old Testament, a Psalm, a gospel reading, and an entry from one of the epistles. After a cycle through the 3-year program, some pastors choose to venture out and preach through a whole book of the Bible. Others settle into a pattern of preaching primarily from the gospels year after year. There are pros and cons in choosing our Scripture readings from the lectionary.

One of the main advantages is that it helps us move around and learn from various types of biblical literature. We can choose from law, history, poetry, gospel, epistle, and apocalyptic literature such as Daniel and Revelation. Another advantage is that it helps the pastor and worship leaders avoid getting stuck on one or more hobby horse themes. For example, you probably don't want to hear, in infinite detail, about battles of the Old Testament or about Luke's focus on meals in every single sermon for a whole calendar year! One main disadvantage of the lectionary is that it doesn't cover a very high percentage of the entire Bible. Another disadvantage is that it makes it more difficult to preach on contemporary issues or on specific concerns in the life of the local church.

During June, we will have the chance to combine the methods of lectionary use and sermon series. We will be focusing our attention on the lectionary selections from the book of Second Corinthians. For the five Sundays of June, that will give us a chance to concentrate on a single book of the Bible. We will do the same thing from July 21st through August 11th, with a concentration on Paul's letter to the Ephesians. This allows us to stick with the lectionary and still have the benefits of spending time in an individual book of the New Testament. In the future, we may branch out and use this "multi-part series" approach to explore some of the books of the Bible which are not very well represented in the Revised Common Lectionary.

Paul's letters to the Corinthians give us a lot of insight into his career and personality, as well as his special relationship with an early church community. He spent eighteen months among the people of Corinth, and so he felt a real kinship with that body of believers. He saw some things going on in the church that disturbed him, so he wrote them several letters. He also, famously and vigorously, felt the need to defend himself from leaders who came after him and criticized his credentials, abilities, and motivations. All of those dynamics give us glimpses into the life of the early church and show us that there have always been challenges and controversies associated with the spread of the good news of the gospel. I'm looking forward to learning more about Paul and about his life and work in those early days. Hope you can join us for the series!
