

A Message from Pastor Mike.....

November is an important month in the life of our country and in the church calendar too. We have the tradition, privilege, and responsibility to vote in early November. This is also the month that we honor our veterans. Long ago, following the end of World War I, a day was set aside to remember those who have served our country. What we now call Veterans Day was originally called Armistice Day. A treaty was signed and went into effect at 11AM on 11/11/1918, marking the end of that First World War.

In the church calendar, we honor those who have gone before us on the first day of November. Our tradition at 15th Avenue, as in many other churches, is to remember loved ones who have passed away during the previous 12 months. All Saints Day is an appropriate time to remember all of those who have gone before us. We remember and we are grateful for the time we had with our loved ones. Just as we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, we set aside one Sunday of the year to give God thanks for family and friends who have loved us, sacrificed for us, and influenced our lives for the better. We wrap up the liturgical year in late November, setting up the four Sundays of Advent as the beginning of a new year.

Our Scripture selections for this November will be somewhat of a reversal from our normal pattern. In a typical month, we might find ourselves in the New Testament three times and in the Old Testament once. This year, we will explore three books of the Old Testament (Ruth, 1 Kings, and Daniel,) during November and then close out the final Sunday of the month in the Book of Revelation, in the passage where we are reminded that Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. That last Sunday of the month wraps up what is known as *Ordinary Time*. We have been in Ordinary Time ever since Pentecost Sunday, way back at the beginning of the Summer!

The last Sunday of the church year will fall on November 27th this year. That day is known as *Christ the King* or *Reign of Christ* Sunday. The church year then starts over with the season of Advent which is celebrated on the four consecutive Sundays preceding Christmas Day. In the Disciples of Christ tradition, there has historically been less emphasis on the seasons of the church calendar than might be found in church traditions with more focus on liturgy. However, in recent years, more and more churches have been paying attention to the cycle of the church seasons, because they help us mark the major events in Jesus' life on earth. We remember Jesus' birth, dedication, baptism, crucifixion, resurrection, and the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. May God bless you as we observe and remember all of those special days in the life of Jesus over the coming year.
