


A Message from Pastor Mike—

December is full of rich traditions for the church. Our Advent and Christmas celebrations will bring us to the end of the calendar year. We begin a new church year, with a focus in the coming months, on the gospel of Luke. This is the gospel writer who gave us a detailed account of the birth of Jesus, provides insight for us on his life as a child, his ministry in Galilee, and much more. Luke was a historian. The epistle to the Colossians refers to him as a physician. "Our dear friend Luke, the doctor, and Demas send greetings." Col. 4:10-11,14 He is also mentioned in the New Testament Letter to Philemon and in the letter known as II Timothy. We know that he was a follower of Christ, with a strong background in the Jewish scriptures. He probably grew up in Antioch in Syria. Scholars believe that Luke had a copy of Mark's gospel as he wrote out his own version of events in the life of Jesus. His two-volumes, The Gospel according to Luke, and the Book of Acts, provide us with an excellent window into the birth and growth of the faith.

Although Luke tells us that he wasn't an eyewitness to Jesus' earthly ministry, he was an excellent storyteller who provides us with many of the details we know about Jesus' life, ministry, death, and resurrection. Luke's gospel account of Jesus' travels through Galilee and toward Jerusalem paint a dramatic picture for us, helping us understand what was at stake as Jesus suffered and died and rose again. In Acts, the action then moves outward from the city of Jerusalem to the wider world. Luke tells us about the women who followed Jesus and who provided leadership and support to the early ministry efforts of that first generation of Christians. This gospel is full of references to shared meals and meaningful relationships. We have evidence that Luke traveled widely with Paul, and there is also a tradition that he lived to the age of 84.

According to Bible scholar and professor Luke Timothy Johnson, these two books provide us with about 60 years of coverage on a critical era that changed the world. With 24 chapters in Luke and 28 chapters in Acts, the combined work of Luke makes up just over one-fourth of the entire New Testament. The last half of Acts also provides us with some of our best background material on the Apostle Paul. While we will continue to explore Old Testament and epistle texts on Sunday mornings, our gospel focus over the coming year will give us a chance to explore the good news as it was written by Luke. May your time of waiting in Advent be fruitful, and may you and your family have a joyful and a very merry Christmas!




BRUNCH-OUT
