A message from Pastor Mike-

People who are scheduled to perform or sing or play an instrument or speak in public are often said to suffer from a malady that has been referred to as "butterflies." That is a description we can relate to. It's in the stomach, I guess you'd say. It's like a mild dose of anxiety. There are legitimate concerns for doing a good job, mixed together with swirling questions about worst-case outcomes. "*What if I mess this up? What if I lose my place? What if I just go blank?*" We know what a person means when they say they have butterflies. We've probably been there before ourself. To take that image one step further, I believe that its possible for all of us to have a collective sense of butterflies when the calendar flips over to a new year! ~ Thankful, Grateful, Blessed ~


