



. A message from Pastor Mike

Off and on, over the years, I have been intrigued by an epiphany that author and monk Thomas Merton had at the corner of Fourth and Walnut in Louis-ville, Kentucky, on March 18, 1958. Normally tucked away in the monastery, Merton had an appointment of some kind on that day and he found himself on a busy street corner. This is what he had to say about that moment:

"In Louisville, at the corner of Fourth and Walnut, in the center of the shopping district, I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all these people, that they were mine and I theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. It was like waking from a dream of separateness, of spurious self-isolation in a special world. . . . This sense of liberation from an illusory difference was such a relief and such a joy to me that I almost laughed out loud. . . . I have the immense joy of being man, a member of a race in which God Himself became incarnate. As if the sorrows and stupidities of the human condition could overwhelm me, now that I realize what we all are. And if only everybody could realize this! But it cannot be explained. There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun. Then it was as if I suddenly saw the secret beauty of their hearts, the depths of their hearts where neither sin nor desire nor selfknowledge can reach, the core of their reality, the person that each one is in God's eyes. If only they could all see themselves as they really are. If only we could see each other that way all the time. There would be no more war, no more hatred, no more cruelty, no more greed. . . . But this cannot be seen, only believed and 'understood' by a peculiar gift." - Thomas Merton - Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander

Maybe the reason that scene makes such a strong impression is because I suspect that we may all be given those special moments! We may all be given those moments, by the grace of God, but we must be attentive enough to recognize and meditate on them. Having said that, it's a bit ironic that Merton went from a place of quiet reflection in the monastery, to a busy city intersection to receive that illumination! Paying attention is no easy task in our fast-paced world. Maybe it takes Divine intervention before we take the time to really look around (and look up)! If we are going to love our neighbor, we will need to look up and see them. If we're going to love God with our whole heart and soul, and mind and strength, we will have to make time to just "be." To be the beloved children of God that the Bible assures us that we are! As followers of Christ, we are being transformed into the image of God. We are truly blessed. Watch for those special moments of blessing in your life. Have a wonderful Spring!


