### A Message from Pastor Mike.....

Have you ever read the Bible all of the way through, from cover to cover? Perhaps not that many people would have had time (or made time) to do that in our busy culture. I have read all of the Bible over the years, but there are certainly parts which I have read much more often than others. When I was being questioned in my final ordination interview, one committee member asked me a very interesting question. He said, "If your life was over and your family or a close friend was thumbing through the Bible you had used most frequently, over a long period of time, which books of the Bible would be the most marked up? Which books would have the most wear and tear on the pages?" My answer was three-fold, including one book each from the Old Testament, the gospels, and the epistles. The Book of Psalms would be near the top of the list because there is just no substitute for the beauty of the language of prayer found within those 150 "hymns." The gospel I have read most often is Mark. That one moves right along from one scene to the next like the good story that it is. The epistle which I go back to frequently is Paul's letter to the Romans. He wrote that one later in his life and it is kind of a capstone summary of what he felt was most important for Christians to know about their faith.

How would you answer that question? Do you have favorite books of the Bible that you read more often than others? Have you ever seen any of those guides for reading through the whole Bible in a year? There are programs that show you what books and chapters to read each day to make it through all 66 books of the Bible in one year. Another popular option entails reading through the Old Testament once and the New Testament twice in one year. You can also find a plan that allows you to spread the reading over two years. There are options for reading chronologically, rather than in the order the various books appear in our Bibles. There are many themes and schemes for mapping out a structured reading plan that will guide you through the greatest story ever told! While there are many versions of the Bible, some of them are more conducive to a daily reading program than others. Modern translations, like Eugene Peterson's *The Message*, are a joy to read devotionally. Some of the study Bibles, on the other hand, can have so many interesting footnotes that it can make it hard to concentrate on the narrative of the text itself! However you choose to do it, I encourage you to read God's word often! May God bless you and keep you as we continue to celebrate these weeks of the Easter season.


