

A Monthly Newsletter 15th Avenue Christian Church

Our June Scripture readings will include Jesus' prayer in John chapter 17, the account of the Day of Pentecost from the Book of Acts, some of the Apostle Paul's thoughts from Romans chapter 5, an account of Elijah's flight from danger in Second Kings, and an entry from chapter 5 of Galatians. What we call the "Lord's Prayer" comes from an occasion when the disciples asked Jesus *how* to pray. The prayer that Jesus prayed after the Last Supper, detailed in John chapter 17, is what we might call the personal prayer of Jesus, on our behalf, and on behalf of what would become the church. The overall theme of that prayer is that Jesus has claimed us and prayed for us, his followers, members of the church, that we might continue the work that he did on earth. As we know all too well, that just isn't possible if we try to do the work in our own strength! Fortunately, the reading from Acts tells us that Jesus did send the Comforter, just as he had promised he would. The apostles were not powerful and well educated. They had a very hard time catching on to the lessons that Jesus taught them. Even so, once they had received the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, they were able to go out and change the world! They faced unbelievable hardships and yet they spread the gospel all over the known world of their day.

The text from Romans is about faith, grace, hope, and love. In chapter 19 of the 1st Book of Kings, we see an early example of what we know all too well from personal experience. Just because we belong to God, follow God, and obey God's word, things can still go very wrong! Not all of our days and years will go smoothly. We will see that Elijah had to flee for his life from the evil rulers Ahab and Jezebel! We will wrap up the month in Paul's Letter to the Galatians. There we have another example of the golden rule, to "love your neighbor as yourself." In those verses, we are reminded that the gifts of the Spirit are the result of Jesus' prayer for us, that we will have the Holy Spirit to strengthen us. Verses 22 and 23 list the gifts, or the fruit, of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. All of these portions of Scripture combine to bring us the good news that we have been claimed by God, and equipped to follow in Jesus' footsteps! God bless your summer!

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. - Acts 2:1-4 -
