A Message from Pastor Mike......

The ideas of call, calling, and vocation turn out to be a complicated set of concepts. One of our seminary professors told a small group of us that he has found it helpful to think in terms of God having a *purpose* for his life rather than a *plan* for his life. He said that when we think of a plan, we picture specific steps, just the right timing, and all of the correct turns at each stage of life. If we feel like we missed a step or took a wrong turn along the way, then we are tempted to assume we have missed out on, or messed up, God's plan. If we think of it as God having a purpose for our lives, then those specific steps and timings aren't so central to the overall flow as they are in a plan. Living the life of faith turns out to be more like a purpose than a plan.

We are all called, and we are all ministers. I know that in theory, but I also know it much better now because all of you in the congregation here at 15th Avenue Christian Church have ministered to me. I thank all of you for your ministry to me, to your whole church family, and to your communities.

Some years ago, I made a campus visit to the seminary in Dubuque. They offer a weekend where you can tour the campus, meet professors, sit in on a class lecture and so forth as a way to discern if seminary is right for you. As we settled in to hear a lecture on Christian doctrine, they told those of us who were auditing the class to just listen and not ask any questions. (I leaned over to my neighbor and told her she may need to give me an elbow in the ribs if I forgot and started to ask a question! She said, "I will tackle you if I have to!!!")

After the lecture, there was a Q&A time where the professor answered a question by noting that some theologians have said that God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit are each not fully themselves unless they are in community with each other. That is, God is *relational* in an ultimate way. The implications of that for us, being created in the image of God, struck me like a thunderbolt that day! We, as individuals, are not fully *who we are* unless we are in relationship with others; with those in our families, churches, workplaces and communities. We are relational beings, just like our Creator. That insight has returned to me over and over in recent years. It has become a part of how I think of ministry, and the Christian hope that underlies and supports all of our ministry. That is why our gathering around the table, each week, together, is so central to what we do, and who we are, as Disciples of Christ.




