A Message from Pastor Mike.....

Often, on Sunday mornings, our Scripture readings help us see the necessity and benefit of being intentional about our spirituality. Both grief and healing may be integral, or at least developmental, parts of our growth and our faith journeys. It can be a lifelong struggle to fully understand God's unfailing love and eternal purpose for our lives. Scripture helps give us a higher and more accurate vision of our purpose than we can arrive at on our own. As we are all aware, there can be a persistent fallenness in the human experience. Fortunately, we have also been given the limitless grace of God to help us and sustain us along our pathway.

It takes time and effort to really pay attention to our wounded and our true selves. We are often in need of an expanded and deepened sense of our worth as children of God. Do problematic circumstances imply that hope is somewhat irrational? Can people change? Will people do the right thing? Where is the good news in this economic statistic, or in that thinktank projection? Does enlightened self-interest drive most of our consumer decisions? Having evidence, logic and being "rational" is not always a mindset that is fully compatible with the hope of the gospel. Acts 16:26 describes a prison-shaking earthquake and bears witness that the prisoners' chains fell away. The foundations were shaken and the doors were rattled open! The spiritual life is never boring! Living into our callings will require us to connect the dots between our limited, status quo, self-image and the truth that we are image-bearers who are both claimed and called.

A cynical or weary heart may see what it thinks is clear-eyed reality, but the new heart, that gift of the Spirit, helps us see God's grace in even the most difficult circumstances. We have the risk of getting stuck at at an early level of the faith, and then of not realizing that there is anything more. Even when we don't know what in the world is going on out there, it may actually be a good starting point to have an unfulfilled sense of longing... to be spiritually discontented enough to explore possibilities for a deeper understanding of faith, hope, and love. In St. Paul's words, the hope that we need is already among us through the power of the Holy Spirit. A new heart can help us rest in the finished work of Christ, clinging to the promises of God that the kingdom of heaven is already here! Embracing a new and improved perspective of hope allows us to see, with the eyes of our hearts, grace upon grace (John 1:16). Somewhere I saw that verse described as "grace piled up". It is that life-sustaining grace and hope which can propel us to seek a closer relationship with God. May God bless you as we move into Advent!

"What can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal." (2 Cor. 4:18).


