## *A message from Pastor Mike—*

In the Book of 2 Corinthians, Paul wrote, *“For it is the God who said, ‘Let light shine out of darkness,’ who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.”*

Paul identified himself as an apostle of Christ who preached the good news that Jesus had come in the flesh. Paul, at great cost to himself, relayed the core message that the kingdom of God had come near. He spelled out the upside-down nature of the kingdom. Conflict can lead to comfort and even to contentment. Power can be manifested through weakness and through humility. Jesus' way was both different and *difficult*. Paul was saying that it's not about us! We are fallible containers, but we are given priceless treasure to carry around. We stand in a long line of Christians who have testified of God's goodness, mercy, blessing and joy. Paul reminds us, across the centuries, to not lose heart when the chips are down. He reminds us that we are being renewed day by day, that we are blessed abundantly, and that the gifts of God are to be shared in this world of scarcity, confusion and despair.

Paul's instructions apply for us as we carry on the work of the church. It really isn't about us, we're simply pointing each other to the one makes all things new. Brittle and low cost clay pots were not worth much by themselves. It's what was *in* those containers that really mattered. That is still true for us as we enter the new year.

In the normal course of our lives, we can expect to run into those who are looking for the temporary treasures that modern life puts front and center. In the flashiness of our consumer culture, the good news of the gospel might seem out of touch to people who aren't sure what they are looking for... who aren't yet open to a message of hope and joy.

Following Paul's lead, we know that it is when we rely on God that we are most effective. Even in our human state, we are designated carriers of the treasure. We aren't the treasure, we are *toting* the treasure! We carry the good news in our hearts and in our souls. *“We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord...”* As witnesses, we do have our work cut out for us! We carry the joy of the Lord around with us. Our job is to let it bubble over! May God bless you as you go about that important work all through the dawning new year!

*“We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed.”* - 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 -








Each of the scriptures below takes ten minutes or less to write out. Commit to spending ten minutes each day listening to God's voice as you simply copy these texts out of your Bible.
