


A Message from Pastor Mike—

If you attend a sporting event or other entertainment venues, you may receive a program to help guide you along. Like the Sunday bulletin, those printed programs help you understand who is who, and what will happen when. After a stretch of months in Ordinary Time within the church calendar, we are now entering the season of Advent. This is a season with a language all its own! In a way, we almost need a program to remind us of all of the special language the church has traditionally connected with this particular season. There are wreaths and candles. There are readings and special colors. We have "The Hanging of the Greens" Chrismons, and Gaudete Sunday. Advent is both a season of waiting and a season of active preparation.

Advent is said to date back to the 4th century, when it was used as a season of preparation for baptism. It leads the Christian community into the Christmas season, but it also points us forward to the Second Coming of Jesus. We get the word Advent from Latin, where *adventus* means coming or arrival. Like our season of Lent, Advent used to be 40 days long and it had penitential elements like fasting and prayer. Once again this year, we will experience weekly themes of hope, peace, joy and love. Our hope is grounded in Christ's birth and in the promises that we have of Jesus' return at the end of the church age. Our peace rests on the message of peace found in Jesus' birth on Christmas morning. That unusual word Gaudete, used to describe the third Sunday of the season, is another Latin word meaning "rejoice ye." During that week we are reminded to "rejoice in the Lord always." Our joy is found in anticipation of the deep meaning that we experience at this special time of year. The focus on love reminds us that God 'so loved the world that he gave his only Son for all of us'!

It takes time to prepare our hearts and minds for the message of Christmas. Advent is almost like a rehearsal for the peace and joy that we find in remembering the birth of Jesus, and in his promised return. Advent wreaths remind us that God's love for us is "evergreen," or eternal. The preparations of Advent lead us into the celebrations of Christmas. From there we move into Epiphany and the circular church year plays out once again. All of this special language is meant to help us understand the magnificence of God's plan to bring us back from wandering in the wilderness. We need all the help we can get from language to comprehend the blessed hope we have in the mercy, grace, and promises of our wonderful God! Merry Christmas to all!




CHRISTMAS OFFERING DECEMBER 14 & 21, 2025




